

Welcome Back to School!

Here's everything you need to know to get your child off to a great start.

Logistics & Daily Routine

- **School Hours for K5-6th Grade**

- The arrival carline begins at 7:45am and ends at 8:45am. Teachers go into the building at 8:45am and the circle drive is then blocked with cones. If you drop off your child between 8:45am-8:50am, you must walk your child into the building, but they are not considered "tardy" until 8:50am. After 8:50am, all students must walk inside and check-in with their parents.

- Dismissal Carline - 3:50pm-4:10pm (Please see map attached to this packet.)
- You may begin lining up for carline dismissal 5 minutes prior to the start time. Parents arriving early should line up in the parking lot across the street. If you have multiple children with different dismissal times, you may pick up all your children together at the last dismissal of the day.

- **School Hours for 7th-10th Grade**

- Arrival carline begins at 7:45am. Students in 7th-10th grade must check-in at the main office for an admit slip if they are dropped off after 8:30am.
- Daily Lunch Time
- M,T,W,F - 12:26pm-1:06pm, Thur. (Chapel Day) - 11:50am-12:20pm
- Dismissal carline begins at 3:30pm and ends at 3:45pm.

- **School Hours for 11th and 12th Grade**

- Arrival carline begins at 7:45am. Students in 11th and 12th grade must check-in at the main office for an admission slip to enter class after 8:15am.
- Daily Lunch Time

- M,T,W,F - 11:42am-12:22pm, Thur. (Chapel Day) -10:33am-11:08am o Dismissal carline begins at 3:15pm and ends at 3:30pm.

*Due to an abundance of traffic during dismissal times, all parents wishing to check their child out early from the front office must do so BEFORE 3:00pm.

**Campuswide devotion time will be from 9:15am-9:25am. If your child arrives at school during this time frame, they will be asked to wait at the main office until devotion time has ended.

- **Before/After School Care:**

- Before Care: 7:00am-7:45am. Before school care is available for all ages and is held in the multi-purpose room area. Parents may drop off at the last door on the left down the circle drive. Before care is not offered on inclement weather days. The cost is \$3.00/day and is charged to your FACTS account the following week. Parents only pay the fee the following week for the mornings they needed to utilize the program from the week prior.
- After Care: 4:10pm-6:00pm. After-school care is available for all ages and meets in the multi-purpose room area. Parents must park and enter the main lobby after 4:10pm to pick up their child. An aftercare door code will be provided to parents who utilize this program daily. For parents only utilizing this program occasionally, you will need to ring the doorbell and be admitted to the school by a staff member in our front office. After school care is not offered on early dismissal days. The cost is \$12.00/day and is charged to your FACTS the following week. Parents only pay the fee the following week for the afternoons they needed to utilize the program from the week prior. Snack is provided for students in the program each day at 5:00pm.
- If for some reason you cannot pick up your child prior to 4:10pm, they will automatically be enrolled into aftercare.

What to Bring on the First Abbreviated Day of School

- **7th-12th Grade Abbreviated Day:** Tuesday, August 11th, 2026. (8:30am-11:45am) o Carline begins at 7:45am.
 - All students should arrive in regular school uniform on the abbreviated day.

- All students should bring in **only** the school supplies collected by teachers (as indicated below) and drop them off at the tables located in the gym. Student lockers will be assigned on Wednesday, August 19th. Until then, students only need to bring a notebook and pencil/pen with them daily. **There is a flyer in this packet detailing which items your child needs to bring with them on the abbreviated day.**
 - Parents may begin to arrive for dismissal at 11:30am. If you arrive before this time, please wait in the Rotary parking lot across the street from the school. Please do not park on the street; either pull into the circle drive or wait in the parking lot across the street.
 - Lunch is not served on abbreviated days, and before and after school care programs are not offered.
 - There is no school for 7th-12th grade students on Wednesday, August 12th or Thursday, August 13th. Junior/senior high students will return to campus for the first full day on August 14th.
- **Kindergarten-6th Grade Abbreviated Day: Wednesday, August 12th, 2026. (8:50am-12:00pm)**
 - Carline begins at 7:45am.
 - Students in **1st-6th grade** must be dropped off in carline and will enter through the gym doors to drop off their school supplies at the tables provided.
 - All students should bring in **only** the school supplies collected by teachers on this abbreviated day. **A flyer is included in this packet detailing which items your child needs to bring with them.**
 - All students should arrive in regular school uniform beginning on the abbreviated day.
 - **Kindergarten** students typically have a family member come in with them for their first day of school. **Only** these families may park and walk their child to the main awning entrance. You will then be guided to our multi-purpose room area to wait for their first day of school to begin. Parents may carry in their child's supplies and drop them off with the staff waiting in the multi-purpose room. (After this day, all kindergarten students must be dropped off in regular carline.)
 - Parents may begin lining up for dismissal at 11:40am. Please begin lining up for dismissal in the Rotary parking lot across the street from the school. A staff member will signal when to move.
 - Lunch is not served on abbreviated days, and before and after school care programs are not offered.
 - There is no school for elementary students on Thursday, August 13th for a teacher workday.

***The first full day of school for ALL students Kindergarten - 12th grade is Friday, August 14th, 2026.**

Communication

- Each Tuesday, a school-wide email will be sent home to parents outlining pertinent information and upcoming events.

- Email communication will be coming home from the school each week on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Fridays.

Learning Expectations

Academic Information

- Junior and senior high student academics will begin on August 17th.
 - All 7th-12th grade students will receive two important documents on the first days of school: the handbook awareness agreement, and the 24/7 student morality agreement. Both documents must be signed by the student and the parent and must be returned to school before August 21st. If students fail to turn in these forms, they will be sent home by an administrator and not be allowed to attend school until the forms have been completed.
 - Please read the handbook. So often, we wait until issues arise to access the handbook information. Please proactively read about policies and expectations BEFORE the school year begins!
- Elementary student academics will begin the week of August 17th.
- **Grading and Feedback Policy:** Each member of our wonderful staff at LCA has 24 hours to reply to parental communication. (This may be regarding grades, homework, behavior, etc.) An email, or in-person conversation, is the first step in addressing concerns or feedback regarding academics. If you do not receive a response within the 24-hour window of time, please reach out to the academic office.

Health & Safety

- **Medication/Allergy Concerns**

- If your child requires medication throughout the school day, you must fill out a student medication form. (This form is included in this packet and can be turned into the main office.) All medicines must be clearly labeled with the student's name and dosage instructions. Students are NOT allowed to keep medications with them during the day.
- If your child has an epi-pen, please turn it into the main office with the student medication form attached.

- **Emergency Procedures**

- During the first month of school, we will be practicing all our emergency drills. (Fire, tornado, and lockdown.)
- For student safety, please always follow the direction of our staff. Our goal is always to serve you quickly.
- It is always wise to bring your photo ID with you when picking up your child. Some new staff members may not be able to visually ID our parents, so please be patient as we learn new faces.
- Please do not be offended if you are greeted by an intercom at our main lobby. This is a security measure we take to keep our students safe.
- All visitors on campus must have a previously scheduled meeting communicated with our staff. For student safety, the main office does not allow visitors to gain entrance without prior approval.
- If you are entering the main office at the school for any reason, please do not hold the door open for others. Each family should use their assigned door code **or** be admitted by a member of our office staff.

Student Dress Code Information



Lancaster Christian Academy is a relational, fun, and grace-filled environment. With our main purpose being the development of our students spiritually, we also desire to create an atmosphere that honors the Lord where exceptional learning can take place! Our dress code has been thoughtfully created to help us carry the mission and vision of our school forward.

It is the expectation that students dress in LCA branded tops made available and approved by the school leadership to school each day. The options will be made available by orientation each year and may be purchased anytime at our central office. Bottoms may be purchased at any store if they follow the rules specified below. All clothing is to be washed frequently and free of tears, cuts, and holes. No modifications to LCA branded clothing are acceptable. All attire is to be neat, clean, and in good taste/appropriate sizing. No article of clothing shall be worn that distracts from the educational process.

Our dress code will be strictly enforced.

All students who arrive at school out of dress code (without approval from the administration) will be asked to call a parent so that appropriate clothing may be brought to school.

Repetitive offenses may result in suspension or expulsion.

TOPS:

Students K5R-12th grade are expected to be in LCA branded tops Monday through Friday. Non LCA branded clothing is not allowed except when being worn as an undergarment. These undergarments must be a solid color (black, white, or gray) with no writing, symbols, or pictures showing. Shirts must be a proper length for when both arms are raised above the head, no part of the stomach or back will be showing.

Each year there will be an assigned uniform shirt color for FIELD TRIPS. Students going on a field trip are required to wear that color shirt on that day. If a student arrives at school on his/her field trip day not wearing the assigned field trip color, a parent/guardian will be notified so that the correct color polo may be dropped off. If the correct polo cannot be dropped off in time, a field trip polo will be given to the student and the cost will be charged to the student's FACTS account.

BOTTOMS:

All students must wear non-denim material bottoms with no patterns a solid, uniform color.

Students K5R-2nd grade may wear pants, shorts, and skirts (skirts are allowed for females only). Girls may wear leggings in dark colors only (i.e. black, navy, or dark gray). Shorts and skirts must be the length of at least a 5" inseam. Skirts must be worn with shorts or leggings underneath.

Female students 3rd-12th grade may wear slacks or dress pants, shorts, or skirts. Skirts must have an inseam length of at least 8 inches and must be worn with shorts or leggings underneath. Uniform style shorts may be worn with an inseam length of at least 6 inches.

Male students 3rd-12th grade may wear slacks or dress pants or shorts. Uniform style shorts may be worn with an inseam length of at least 8 inches.

FOOTWEAR:

Acceptable footwear includes dress shoes, dress boots, dress sandals with ankle strap, leather shoes, canvas shoes, and tennis shoes. LCA students are expected to maintain a well put together appearance: no rips, tears, stains, or holes. Tennis shoes will be required when taking a P.E. class. The following footwear are not permitted for students at any time: Flip flops, crocs, and slides/house shoes (such as Uggs, Tasmans, slippers, etc.).

SPIRIT DAY:

One day per week will be reserved for Knight's Athletic "spirit" wear. Students may wear a Knight's spirit t-shirt with jeans or regular uniform bottoms on this assigned day. Spirit t-shirts cannot be homemade.

Current year spirit shirts will be announced by orientation and available for purchase online only at lancasterchristianacademy.com. Spirit wear is optional. Students that choose not to wear a spirit shirt, will revert back to the regularly established dress code.

This privilege is provided for students in order to fundraise for our Athletic Department. LCA reserves the right to take away this privilege for any reason. For spirit days that fall on a field trip day, students will be required to wear the assigned field trip LCA branded dress code.

OUT OF UNIFORM DAYS:

There will be occasions where students will be allowed to attend school out of uniforms. On these days, students are still required to follow the following guidelines:

Students are to wear appropriate, comfortable, and safe clothing that is neat, clean, and in good taste (no rips, tears, stains, or holes). No article of clothing shall be worn that distracts from the educational process. Clothing promoting or supporting a lifestyle in conflict with Biblical character will not be allowed. This includes, but is not limited to, any attire displaying or promoting drugs/drug use, shirts promoting individuals/artists who do not promote Christian values/conduct in living, political propaganda, or any other items that could cause racial or divisive conversation among their peers. Articles of clothing that contain statements or suggestions that are vulgar, contain illegal substances (including alcohol, drugs, tobacco), and/or is sexually oriented are not permitted. Any dress or statement that may cause a hostile, intimidating, degrading, offensive, harassing, or discriminatory environment is prohibited.

Shorts and skirts must be the length specified for normal uniform days. Leggings must be covered by shorts, a skirt, or a dress of proper length specified above for 3rd-12th grade. Footwear rules remain the same.

SPECIAL OCCASIONS:

Special occasions such as Homecoming and Coming Home courts, award banquets, performances, and pictures days may offer unique parameters to dress code that will be communicated to parents/guardians prior to the occasion.

ATHLETICS:

Please see athletic forms for information on sports dress code standards.

DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS:

Procedures for violations of the school Dress Code for Elementary Students (K5-6th Grade):

1. First Offense: The classroom teacher will contact parents to inform them of the dress code violation. Parents may be asked to bring appropriate dress code attire to school for them to wear for the remainder of the day. If the student does not have an approved crested uniform top, parents may give permission for the student to purchase an LCA crested polo to be worn for the remainder of the day.
2. Second Offense: An administrator will contact parents to inform them of the second offence of a dress code violation. Parents will be asked to bring appropriate dress code attire to school for them to wear for the remainder of the day. If the student does not have an approved crested uniform top, parents may give permission for the student to purchase an LCA crested polo to be worn for the remainder of the day.
3. Further Offenses: A parent meeting will be required.

Procedures for violations of the school Dress Code for Junior and Senior High Students (7th-12th Grade):

1. First Offense: Students will be required to contact parents for appropriate dress code attire to be brought to school for them to wear for the remainder of the day. If the student does not have an approved crested uniform top, parents may give permission for the student to purchase an LCA crested polo to be worn for the remainder of the day.
2. Second Offense: Student will be issued a dress code infraction, and students will be required to contact parents for appropriate dress code attire to be brought to school for them to wear for the remainder of the day. If the student does not have an approved crested uniform top, parents may give permission for the student to purchase an LCA crested polo to be worn for the remainder of the day.
3. Third Offense: Student will be issued a demerit, and students will be required to contact parents for appropriate dress code attire to be brought to school for them to wear for the remainder of the day. Students may also serve detention and be required to wear the school polo shirt for the remainder of the semester and will be issued two additional LCA crested polos immediately at the parent's expense (only if the infraction is due to a lack of the appropriate LCA top).
4. Further Offenses: A parent meeting is required.

*Upon parent approval, student drivers may be sent home to change and return to school when out of dress code.

*Any assignments missed due to dress code infractions must be made up at the student's expense, and absences will not be excused.

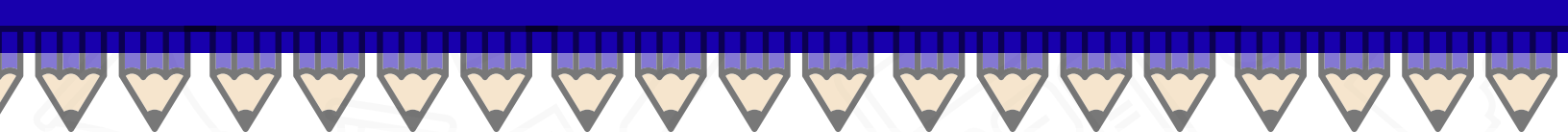

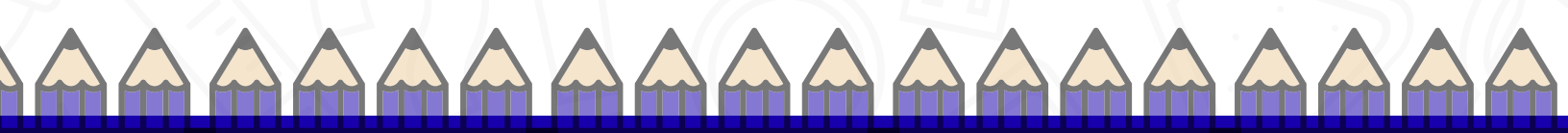

Homework Information

We believe homework serves an important purpose in the educational process. Homework is designed to provide students with intentional, independent practice of concepts and skills that have already been taught and practiced under the direct instruction of their teachers. This independent practice allows students to strengthen their understanding, build confidence, and demonstrate mastery outside of the classroom environment.

At the same time, we believe students need a healthy balance between school, family, church, extracurricular activities, and rest. After spending the majority of the day engaged in classroom instruction, homework should reinforce learning—not dominate a student's time outside of school.

Reading

Reading is one of the most foundational skills a student can develop. The more students read and practice comprehension, the more successful they become across every academic discipline.

Students may receive reading assignments in a variety of subjects, including:

- * Literature or chapter books
- * History passages or textbook sections
- * Science readings

Reading assignments may be assessed the following school day through class discussions, written responses, quizzes, short-answer or extended-response questions, or other classroom activities designed to measure comprehension and application.

Mathematics

Mathematics requires both guided instruction and independent practice. Students often develop a better understanding of mathematical concepts when they work through problems on their own.

Math homework may be assigned to reinforce concepts taught during the school day. Assignments should be intentional and focused, consisting of representative practice problems rather than every problem completed in class. The goal is to reinforce learning without creating unnecessary workload.

Homework Time Expectations

In general, students should not be required to spend more than 30-45 minutes per evening completing assigned homework.

Homework is assigned on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday.

Homework expectations are based on what the average student can reasonably complete within this timeframe. If your child consistently requires significantly more time to complete homework, we encourage you to notify the classroom teacher or the school administration. Extended homework time may indicate that adjustments or additional support are needed, and we are committed to partnering with families to develop an appropriate plan for student success.

Tests and Quizzes

Tests and quizzes are a natural part of the learning process and provide opportunities for students to demonstrate mastery of the material they have learned.

Most Lancaster Christian Academy students have a study hall period during the school day that can be used to prepare for upcoming assessments. Students may also choose to study at home using strategies such as:

- * Reviewing notes
- * Reading assigned material
- * Creating flashcards
- * Completing study guides
- * Practicing fill-in-the-blank notes or other review activities

While these study methods are generally student-directed rather than required homework assignments, they are valuable tools for academic success.

Our teachers work intentionally to prepare students before assessments are given. Through classroom observation, formative assessments, guided practice, review activities, and other instructional strategies, teachers continually evaluate student understanding and readiness. Every effort is made to ensure students are well prepared and confident before taking tests and quizzes.
